Anyone who now receives a positive lateral flow test <u>but has no COVID-19 symptoms</u> will no longer have to take a PCR to confirm the result. This will be effective from Tuesday 11 January.

All adults who are fully vaccinated and children aged 5 to 18 years and 6 months, identified as a contact of someone with COVID-19, should take a lateral flow device (LFT) test every day for 7 days instead of self-isolating.

If the test is negative, they can continue to attend their education setting & continue testing for the remaining 7 days.

If the test is positive, they should self-isolate and if no symptoms follow the guidance below.

If the PCR test is positive, the self-isolation period includes the day your symptoms started (or the day you had the test, if you do not have symptoms.

When to stop self-isolating:

- You can stop self-isolating after 7 days if you complete an LFT test on days 6 and 7 of your self-isolation period and: both tests are negative
- You did both tests at least 24 hours apart
- You <u>do not</u> have a high temperature

If you complete an LFT on day 6 and test positive, wait <u>24 hours</u> before you do the next test, you must have 2 negative LFT result 24 hours apart before you can stop isolating. If you are unsure, please do not send your child in, until you have checked with our office staff.

Remember - You must book and take a PCR test if you have symptoms!
