• Of the pupil premium children in year 2 (3 pupils), 67% achieved at expected standard, 34% at greater depth (100% expected progress) in reading. In writing 34% achieved expected and greater depth attainment (100% expected progress and 34% greater than expected progress). 67% in maths, achieved expected attainment and 34% at greater depth (100% expected progress with 67% greater than expected progress). (Progress data - using internal tracking.)

- Of the pupil premium children in year 6 (3 pupils), 67% achieved at expected standard, 34% at greater depth (67% expected progress and 34% greater than expected progress) in reading. In writing 34% achieved expected attainment (67% expected progress). 67% in maths, achieved expected attainment (100% expected progress). (Progress data EOKS1- EOKS2.)
- Overall in school Pupil Premium Attainment 67% of pupil premium pupils are at
 expected standard+ in reading /17% above expected standard, 42% of pupil premium
 pupils are at expected standard in writing / 8% are above expected standard, 50%
 of pupil premium pupils are at expected standard in maths/ 8% are above expected
 standard.
- Overall in school Pupil Premium Progress Reading 75% made expected progress+ / 25% made greater than expected progress, in writing 75% made expected progress+ / 25% made greater than expected progress and in maths 75% made expected progress+ / 17% made greater than expected progress.
- Attendance for the full academic year 17/18 for Pupil premium pupils was 96.5%. The whole school's attendance was 96.9%.
- ELSA group work impacted positively on the peer relationships, developing selfesteem and readiness to learn.
- The purchase of Pupil Progress Tracking software enabled class teachers and senior leaders to track progress of children in receipt of pupil premium alongside rest of cohorts and to compare to all children nationally in order to raise expectations for this group of children. This data was used in pupil progress meetings.
- Children in year 4 and 6 were able to join the experience of a residential supporting both the wider learning experiences, further development of social skills a growing independence.
- Children in all year groups were able to take part in off site visits. Children benefitted from the different learning environment and the variety of learning opportunities to enhance the classroom work, progress and attainment.
- Parents were pleased to receive help in the form of age related study books
- Day trips and uniform were sensitively paid for by school, which allowed greater self-esteem of appearance.
- Boosters enhanced the provision of learning outside the school day. This enabled the year 6 class to have a broad and balanced curriculum in their timetable.
