## Sports Premium Funding 22/23

We are fortunate to receive additional funding via the P.E. & Sport Premium. For 2022/23 this funding is expected to be a total of £17,790

## **Background to funding**

Following the Olympic Games in 2012 the government provided additional funding into schools for school PE and Sport. It provided funding of £150 million per annum for academic years 2013/14 and 2014/15 this funding has continued into subsequent years and increased in 2017/18,19/20 and 2020/21, 2021/2022 and 2022/23

Schools must use the funding to improve the quality of PE and sport they offer. This in turn will help all pupils develop the skills, knowledge and motivation to lead a healthy and active lifestyle and hopefully a lifelong participation in physical activity and sport.

It is the expectation that schools will see an improvement against the following 5 key indicators:

1. The engagement of ALL pupils in regular physical activity-kick-starting healthy active lifestyles.

- 2. The profile of PE and sport being raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement.
- 3. Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport.
- 4. Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to pupils.
- 5. Increased participation in competitive sport.
