### <u>English</u>

#### <u>Writing</u>

This half term we will be looking at Greek Mythology and writing character descriptions, narratives, non-chronological reports and instruction writing. We will then move on to looking at 'Jabberwocky' which is a nonsense poem written by Lewis Carroll and writing our own nonsense poetry.

#### <u>Grammar</u>

We will be getting ready to write by looking back at pronouns, expanded noun phrases, fronted adverbials, plural and possessive apostrophes and direct and indirect speech before learning about relative pronouns and clauses.

#### <u>Spelling</u>

Attached is a copy of this half terms spellings which children will be tested on each Friday. At St Peter's we follow the 'Words their way' spelling scheme therefore activities based on the spellings set will be carried out daily.

#### <u>Reading</u>

Our guided reading text this half term is 'Atticus and the Ancient Greeks', alongside our weekly guided reading text your child will be taught the skills they need to become a reflective and competent reader in a discrete reading comprehension session. Reading books will be sent home, it is expected that your child reads regularly, to and adult, even if they are a competent reader and this is recorded in their reading record book. We will also visit the school library, where your child can select a book to read for pleasure, on Friday mornings. If your child wishes to change their library book please ensure it is in school on this day.

### <u>Maths</u>

We will start the half term by looking at Roman Numerals to 1,000 before moving on to reading and writing, comparing, partitioning and putting numbers to 1,000,000 on a number line, We will also understand powers to 10 and rounding numbers within 1,000,000.

Weekly times tables and mental maths test will continue on a Friday.
