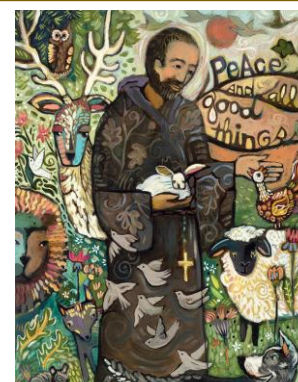

Patron Saint of Ecology

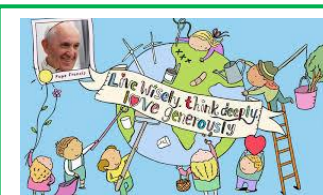
He wrote the Canticle of Creation.
