Order of Mass

1.	Christians go to a Mass on a Sunday because
	it is a Holy Day and they want to worship in
	God.
2.	There are four parts to a celebration of the
	word;
	Gather, listen, give thanks and SEND (go
	forth)
3.	People gather in a Church. Everyone is
	welcome.
	We begin with the sign of the cross.
4.	We listen. During Mass, we listen to God's
	word. The reading ends with, 'The Word of
	the Lord.' We respond with, 'Thanks be to
	God.'
5.	A psalm is usually sung.
6.	We then stand to listen to the Gospel
	reading. The Priest or Deacon ends the
	reading with, 'The Gospel of the Lord.' The
	people respond with, 'Praise to you Lord
	Jesus Christ.'
7.	In the Eucharist Prayer, the priest does what
	Jesus did at the last supper. Catholics
	remember Jesus' sacrifice during the
	Eucharist.
8.	The people are sent out at the end to try to
	live out the messages they have heard and be
	more like Jesus.
