Heating Heroes – LLS Staying warm in the winter is important, and necessary at school to make sure everyone is healthy and can learn. However, the heating in our schools costs a lot of money and, more importantly, uses a huge amount of energy. Making sure the heating is only on when needed, coming up with ways to keep classrooms warm, such as draught excluders and keeping windows clear so that sunlight can heat the room.	2020-21	Yes	Eco Lead	School has invested in new heating system that has greater control over temperature.
