


Key Vocabulary

Word(s)	Definition
Eucharist	The celebration of Mass.
Chalice	A chalice is a large cup used for the precious blood at Mass.
Paten	This is a flat plate used for a single larger host or a number of smaller ones.
Host	The Host is the consecrated bread - it is the Body of Christ.
Blessed Sacrament	The body of Christ that we receive during Holy Communion.
Disciples	People who learn from Jesus and follow his teachings.
Sacrifice	A sacrifice is an act of giving up something to God.
Holy Week	Holy week begins with Palm Sunday and ends on Easter Sunday.
Good Friday	Jesus is sentenced to death, scourged, beaten, crucified and dies on the cross.
Easter Sunday	Jesus rises from the dead.

The reading of the feeding of the five thousand places food at the very centre of the story. God is often identified as feeding His people. We are prompted to actually provide food for the hungry.



The Last Supper


Jesus transforms bread and wine into His body and blood and shares it with his disciples.

Jesus showed his love at the Last Supper and he shares this love when people celebrate the Eucharist.

At Mass, Catholics celebrate in Jesus' memory.



Good Friday commemorates the crucifixion of Jesus Christ.



On Easter Sunday we celebrate Jesus' resurrection from the dead.



Catholics believe that Jesus gives himself in Holy Communion.
