Here is a copy of the spellings your child will be tested on for the term. I hope this will help your child to learn the one he/she finds more difficult rather than merely revising the ones they are already secure with. This term we will be starting with some of the first 100 high frequency words with the expectation that these will be mostly spelt correctly in their writing.

After half term, we will be learning some spelling rules using the 'Words Their Way' programme. The words your child will be tested on are just a few of the words used in school to teach these spelling rules.

In the back of your child's reading record book is a score sheet indicating their weekly test scores. This will need to come back to school each week.
